

Public Affairs Internship with the World Employment Confederation-Europe (three months minimum)

The World Employment Confederation-Europe (WEC-Europe) is looking for a minimum three-month minimum (full time) internship for a political science or law student/graduate with a European affairs or legal background starting on 1st September 2022.

The focus of the internship will be the following:

- To support WEC-Europe public affairs team in the advocacy on key topics of interest to the private employment services industry, such as reaching appropriate regulation for the private employment services industry, ensure a level playing field and social protection for diverse forms of work by creating a shared WEC-Europe position on platform work and using this position in advocacy activities in 2022 and working towards more inclusive labour markets by valuing the role of the private employment services industry with regard to enabling labour market transitions, offering labour market opportunities for young people, developing skills and qualifications and ensuring social protection.
- To contribute to further developing the World Employment Confederation monitoring system on agency work regulation in its members' countries (Europe and global level) and monitoring jurisprudence of the EU Court of Justice directly affecting the sector.
- To contribute to other association activities and projects of the World Employment Confederation.

The World Employment Confederation-Europe is looking for a candidate with the following profile:

- Studies of political science or law with a focus on European affairs
- Fluent command of English and preferably one additional European language
- Openness to work in an international team of the World Employment Confederation Head Office, currently comprising 7 FTEs.
- The candidate must have a valid work permit for Belgium

The internship will be remunerated. Details on the internship contract and remuneration will be provided with the short-listed candidates in the interview phase. There will be the opportunity of remote working for 2 days per week.
